Crosswalks around the School

From time to time the school Traffic Wardens on Osmaston Road and Almadine Drive may be unavailable for duty and the Children's Crossing Unit of the WA Police may be unable to find relief to cover. Therefore we request all students and drivers to be vigilant whilst crossing or driving in school zones.

City of Stirling Parking – Safety

The City of Stirling Parking officers will attend adhoc around the school to monitor and action any instances of illegal parking that are observed within surrounding streets. We do appreciate that most motorists do park in a safe and legal manner when attending the School, however due to several complaints being received by the City regarding occurrences of unsafe and illegal parking, adhoc patrols have now been scheduled. The school has been asked to notify all drivers in our community to be mindful of parking requirements when attending the school, particularly during peak periods.

Key messages about parking safety:-

- Not Stopping or Parking on footpaths (Under State legislation No portion of a vehicle is permitted on or over a footpath)
- Adhering to parking signage
- Not parking on residents' verges or across driveways, and
- Promoting and encouraging the use of alternative transport options including, walking, cycling, and carpooling initiatives.

We all need to work together to ensure our school areas remain safe for all.

NO Dogs or Animals on School Grounds

Please do not bring your animals onto the school grounds. While many of you have great pets who are much loved and give so much love to your family, they can also cause complications at school. We have lots of little and bigger children and adults, entering or leaving the school grounds at the same time. We all love our pets but we need to recognise, that other people may not appreciate being barked at or chased or, in some cases, even growled at when the pet gets overstimulated in such a big moving crowd. Please also ensure that every time you take your animal for a walk, that you dispose of their waste properly so that others don't have to walk in it! Thank you for your cooperation.

Caution during Magpie swooping season



With magpie nesting season now in full swing, the City of Stirling advises the community to take extra care when outdoors. Magpies are a protected native species in Australia; removing their nest is illegal so learning to live alongside wildlife is an important step towards building a better living environment.

Magpies (Koolbardi), Willy Wag Tails (Djidi Djidi) and Wattle Birds (Chuck-a-luck) are among the few birds that fiercely protect their nests, hence their swooping behaviour. Magpies rely largely on intimidating perceived predators, including humans, to protect

their young. They fly low and fast over the person and often clack their bill as they pass overhead. This can be alarming, but the bird will often retreat to a tree and watch until you leave its territory.

Tips that may help you stay safe and reduce the impact of a swooping magpie include:

- Look out for caution signage in our parks and reserves, stay clear of nesting sites and plan alternative routes
- Do not provoke magpies as they swoop to protect their young
- Wear sunglasses, a wide brimmed hat (especially kids) or carry an umbrella
- Travel in groups if possible as the birds often target individuals
- If you are riding a bike, dismount, and walk-through nesting magpie territory
- If you are swooped by a magpie, stay calm, walk away but do not run, and avoid looking at the swooping birds.

SUSTAINABILITY NEWS

Thank you all for your fantastic efforts in recycling. Below are some clarifications and tips:-

Dental Products recycled at school – can be brought from home to school.

Soft Plastics generated from School only - this is for the staff and children to recycle soft plastics at school (recess and lunch wrappers, plastic packaging etc) - only recycle soft plastics with **REDcycle** on the side of plastics/containers.

Soft Plastics Generated from Home – please take to the containers outside Coles and Woolworths - if you click and collect, the staff will accept your bags and take them from you.

Home Recycling Bin - Strawberry punnets, meat trays etc should go in your home recycling (check with your local area recycling dos and don'ts). If you squash your milk bottle and orange juice tops and put them inside the empty bottle they can be recycled too.

Store Recycling - David Jones accept empty beauty product containers, including makeup – pop into the Terracycle box in store.

Thank you all for your efforts in helping us reduce landfill. It is great to see what a bit difference we can make to landfill!


